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#### Timely Tips From your OIS Advisor: Dacia Gauer

- In order to maintain your student visa status **you must register and be present for full-time, in-person courses each term** with the exception of
  recognized school breaks. If approved for a final semester **Reduced Course Load**, you are also required to comply with this requirement. Of your remaining
  courses required for program completion, you may only take one online
  (including hybrid) course. If you only have one course remaining in your
  program, you must take that course in-person.
- Making Spring Break travel plans? Be sure you have requested a travel signature on your immigration document if you do not have a valid one already

   this is reviewed at the Port of Entry as you re-enter the US. Review all travel reminders, required documents, and regulations before your departure <a href="here.">here.</a>

## **Spring 2024 Immigration Reminders**

- Curricular Practical Training is a benefit of F-1 status that permits off-campus training that is
  closely and integrally related to, and takes place during, a student's program of study. To learn more

- Another benefit of the F-1 status, **Optional Practical Training**, allows for graduating students to apply for work authorization upon graduation. ## It's Tax Season! Remember to File by April 15, 2024! New State Tax Filing Option Available.

JHU has partnered with Sprintax to offer the University's international nonresident students, scholars, faculty, staff, and researchers free access to Sprintax's 2023 federal tax preparation software. Brand new this year: Sprintax will also offer assistance with state income tax preparation for a small fee, a widely-requested feature from YOU!


