## **Timely Tips From Blue Jay!**

- Remember: each term you must enroll full-time, in-person. In exceptional cases, it may be possible to qualify for a <u>Reduced Course</u> <u>Load authorization</u>. Only one online/hybrid course can count towards full-time enrollment.
- As we begin a new academic year, keep in mind it is the responsibility of each student to be familiar with the immigration requirements for <u>maintaining their F-1/J-1 status</u>. If you have any questions or need help please <u>contact OIS</u>.
- Has your US address changed? Update this by logging into <u>SIS self-service</u>.

#### J-1 Visiting Student Enrollment Reminder:

Visiting Students in J-1 "<u>Student Non-degree</u>" status must complete enrollment upon arrival to JHU (and for each term they are here). Non-Degree Visiting Students should contact their hosting department administrator to determine the appropriate course(s) in which to enroll for their research and/or study at JHU. **Failure to enroll in a timely manner is a violation of J-1 Status.** 

# Scholars

#### J-1 Regulatory Review:

J-1 Exchange Visitors (EVs) in the Research Scholar, Professor or Short-Term Scholar status are encouraged to visit the OIS website to review the requirements of <u>Maintaining J-1 Status</u>. The J-1 is a U.S.-based immigration status and EVs must ensure J-1 program continuity by engaging full-time in their program objective from within the U.S. *J-1 Exchange programs should take place primarily in- person at DS-2019 approved activity site(s) which are listed on the DS-2019*.

### **Information for J-2 Family Members:**

J-1 Exchange Visitors may choose to have their dependent family members accompany them on their program. The OIS website includes resources for <u>J-2 Dependent Family Members</u> which includes information about how to add J-2 dependent family members to a J-1 program, study in the U.S. and work authorization. J-2 dependents may only engage in employment in the U.S. after receiving authorization (EAD) through USCIS.
